

I serve on the team that has been working diligently and faithfully to develop these changes and more will be coming out about that, but in brief:

• Every person in the Disciples will be able to nominate someone they know to serve on the General Board, which means when these recommendation forms become available, I want to encourage all of you to consider nominating an amazing leader in your ministry/ congregation.

Because I know any change can be overwhelming and not everyone likes to read by-laws, I put together a video about one of the changes to the General Board and the way we all get to recommend people we know to serve. Share in your networks as these changes are really about creating ways to connect individuals and congregations to the whole church. This past summer 29 faithful disciples from the region of Virginia went to Charleston, SC for our second annual Virginia Region Multi-generational mission. We were able to serve in many ways and were planning on returning for a second year. However, with the devastation of Hurricane Helene in Western NC, we are now planning on going to Western North Carolina from Monday June 16 - Saturday, June 21, 2025. The region of Virginia is also planning other ways to help in this recovery effort.

Bon Air Christian Church - House Framing Update

What a glorious day it was on Sept. 7! The front parking lot at Bon Air Christian Church in Richmond, VA was filled with joy and love, as we worked together to build the framing for a family's new home. With 112 people present, we completed 53 sections of framing in just 2 ½ hours! By noon, the framing sections were loaded on the trailer to go to Hillsville and we had eaten lunch. Wow! Thank you to all who helped build, prepare food, and keep us organized.

There were 13 faith communities represented that day, including 11 Disciple congregations: Bon Air, Gayton Rd., 1st Christian Hopewell, The Ministry Church, Seventh St., Perseverance, Springfield, Olive Branch and Slash Christian Churches. Bon Air Presbyterian, Gayton Baptist and the Islamic Center of Virginia were also represented. The house went to the Fuller Center for Housing-Greater Carroll County, VA, for a young couple with a 3 year old daughter and a second child on the way. The Fuller Center functions like Habitat for Humanity. They held a building blitz the next week and got all the framing and the roof trusses installed in two days, then finished the roof, exterior siding, basic HVAC, plumbing and electrical and drywall within 5 days.

This project happened because of the generosity of so many people and churches. Thank you!
